TRINITY TERM 2025 CHAPEL SERVICES AND MUSIC



MAGDALEN COLLEGE OXFORD

We welcome you to our worshipping community at Magdalen. Prayer and praise have been offered to God in this place since the fifteenth century, when the College was founded by William of Waynflete, Bishop of Winchester. The statutes of 1480 make provision for a Choir comprising sixteen boy Choristers and a number of adult Clerks, 'that the worship of God, from whom all good things come, might be increased more widely and better sustained'. That tradition continues unchanged today. The Choirmaster at Magdalen retains the ancient Latin title *Informator Choristarum*, and among those who have held the post over the centuries are John Sheppard, Daniel Purcell, Sir John Stainer, Sir William McKie, and, in more recent years, Dr Bernard Rose. Former choristers include the composer Ivor Novello; the late comedian and actor, Dudley Moore, was Organ Scholar here, and a number of former Academical Clerks hold prominent positions in the musical, legal and media worlds.

We strive to dedicate all our services here to the glory of God. Our music is not an end in itself but part of a larger whole. In selecting music, we seek not only to inspire and to console, but also to challenge. There are many considerations, some of them practical - the volume of music to be learnt by the Choir in any one week, allowances for the periods of term in which illness inevitably strikes - and some seasonal - as we mark the feasts of the Church's year through appropriate liturgical music; some draw on the readings for the day, and others offer theological reflections - a setting of the Magnificat in which Mary's response to Gabriel's call is demure and melodically charming presents a very different view of the Annunciation to a setting in which Mary responds more viscerally, sometimes indicated by more dissonant music, to such a radical and earth-shattering moment (both should be heard). At the same time, we hope that the music sung in this Chapel represents not only something of the extraordinary heritage of which we are the current proud custodians through pieces written by former Clerks, Choristers, Informatores and Organ Scholars (indicated by the symbol ^M next to the name of a composer), but also the richness and diversity of sacred music from across the Christian world in that period, and particularly in the last half-century, when more music by women composers and lesser-known works from the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries have entered the repertoire. Living composers are indicated by the presence of their first name in addition to their surname.

We hope that you will return to this place regularly, but, even if you happen upon just one day in the life of a Chapel and Choir that has sung daily services for over five centuries, we hope that, in the singing and in the silence, in the spoken word and in the beauty of this house of God, you will feel that greater presence, and be blessed by the peace that passes all understanding.

TRINITY TERM

Choral Services

Services are normally sung by the College Choir made up of boy Choristers, educated at Magdalen College School, and male and female Academical Clerks, who are ordinarily students at the College. Evensong on Saturdays is normally sung by the Consort of Voices, in which sopranos join the Academical Clerks. Tuesdays are usually sung by the Choristers alone, and Fridays by the Academical Clerks alone. Compline on Tuesdays is usually sung by two cantors drawn from the Academical Clerks and Consort of Voices. Details are given in the Music List when services depart from this pattern, such as during the school half-term holiday (24th to 30th May). At Festal Evensongs marking saints' days and major feasts of the Church's year, a seasonal antiphon is sung. On Sundays, at the Eucharist, there is a short homily of approximately five minutes, and at Evensong (in some weeks) a sermon of approximately ten minutes. On Sundays, the Eucharist is followed by a simple lunch in the College Hall, and Evensong by drinks in the Antechapel. Compline is followed by drinks in the Old Practice Room.

Organ Music

Organ music plays an integral part in our liturgy. The Assistant Organist, Drew Sellis, and Organ Scholars, Edward Byrne and Henry Morris, play for the majority of the services in Chapel, assisted occasionally by the Informator Choristarum & Organist, Mark Williams, who ordinarily directs the Choir. Details of the organ, by Hermann Eule Orgelbau, can be found on the College website, and details of recitals are given on the following pages.

Visiting Choirs

We are delighted to welcome a number of choirs to sing with us this term. On Saturday 10th May, the Consort of Voices are joined by the Youth Choir of Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford, which provides singing opportunities for former choristers of the Cathedral Choir and Frideswide Voices, alongside 'Ex Collegio', an elite ensemble of Magdalen College School pupils, many of whom are former choristers. On Saturday 14th June, we welcome Hackney Choral, which brings together two choirs run by St Paul's Cathedral Musical Outreach Department – Hackney Senior Choir and Hackney Children's Choir – drawing children from a range of primary and secondary schools in east London. On Tuesday 17th June and Friday 20th June, the Choristers and Clerks respectively are joined by the Choristers of Grace Cathedral, San Francisco, during their UK tour. Our own choir will perform in Grace Cathedral, San Franciso, in April 2026, as part of this exchange.
